



Peter Biedermann is a solo instrumental




Children's Events

Storytimes

The Fall **Storytime** session will meet over a period of seven weeks, from Sep. 16 through Oct. 29, and will accommodate over 50 children. Registration for these storytimes begins in the Children's Department at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, Sep. 2 for Wilbraham residents. Phone registration will be on Friday, Sep. 4. Non-residents may sign up on Sep. 8, as space allows. The times offered are 10:15 a.m. on Wednesdays and Thursdays for ages $2 - 3\frac{1}{2}$ (with a parent) and Thursdays at 11:15 a.m. for ages 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ - 5.

Toddler Two-Step will be held for children 12 - 24 months old on Mondays at 10:15 a.m., for 5 weeks. Dates are Sep. 14, 21, 28, and Oct. 5. **Toddler Two-Step** is a 40-minute class of nursery rhymes,

singing and music for toddlers and their parents or caregivers. It will be a fun-filled program that develops appreciation of language, a true love for their library, and an understanding of symbols that prepare children for reading. The first Monday meeting of the month will be hosted by a leader from Pathways for Parents. Fall Berkshire Trip

On Tuesday, Sep. 29, join the Friends on our autumn trip to the Normal Rockwell Museum in Stockbridge and to Chesterwood - the magnificent home of Daniel Chester French. The comfortable ride and turning foliage will make the trip to Stockbridge easy and sociable.

At the Rockwell Museum, not only will we see works of American's favorite illustrator, but the museum now features art of other illustrators. The museum is considered the nation's premiere collection of visual communication art. Docents will make this a wonderful learning opportunity for anyone interested in graphic art. A catered picnic lunch on the Rockwell pation will be served prior to visiting Chesterwood.

Daniel Chester French was a 19th century artist whose sculptures of the Minuteman in Concord and the Lincolm Memorial in Washington, D.C. are among his best known works. At Chesterwood, we will tour his home, studio and gardens and be treated to an exhibition of modern Boston sculptors on the lovely grounds. Registration forms for this special trip are now available at the Wilbraham Public Library. Register early as these bus trips usually fill fast.
