APPy Hour returns on Sunday, May 4 at 2:00 p.m. Share your favorite apps and learn about new ones on your tablet or smart phone.



Children's Spring Activities

The Spring Storytime session will meet over a period of six weeks, from March 12 through April 17, and will accommodate over 50 children. The following times are offered: ages $2-3\frac{1}{2}$ (with an adult) on Wednesdays at 10:15 a.m. or Thursdays at 10:15 a.m. The older group, for ages $3\frac{1}{2}-5$, will meet on Thursdays at 11:15 a.m. Registration for Storytimes will be held at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, February 26 for Wilbraham residents. Phone calls will be taken starting on February 28. Non-residents may sign up on March 3, as space allows.

Toddler Two-Step will be held for children 12 - 24 months old on Mondays at 10:15 a.m., for 6 weeks (March 3, 10, 17, 24, 31 and April 7). *Toddler Two-Step* is 20 minutes of nursery rhymes, singing and music for toddlers and their parents or caregivers. Registration for these storytimes begins at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, February 26 for Wilbraham residents. Phone registration will be on February 28. Non-residents may sign up on March 3, as space allows. To expand our offerings for the young, two of these Monday meetings (the first Monday of the month) are presented by Pathways for Parents, funded by the MA Department of Early Education and Care. Signups are required. These are fun and informational classes with stories, songs and activities, hosted by Cindy Milner, lead teacher.

Also offered by the Pathways for Parents staff, will be *Welcome*, *Baby!*, a 3-week session for new parents and their babies (ages newborn to 12 months) on Tuesday afternoons in March, starting at 1:00 p.m. Topics covered will include parental well-being, baby signing, baby massage, socialization and baby yoga. Dates are set for March 11, 18 and 25. Registration for *Welcome*, *Baby!* begins on February 26.

Cover to Cover, the book discussion groups for students, are on-going, meeting once a month. Students in grades 4, 5, and 6 will be meeting Tuesdays from 7:00 p.m. – 7:45 p.m. on March 11, April 8 and May 13. Our May get-together will be the final meeting of the school year. Titles are as follows:

March - Rump: the true story of Rumpelstiltskin by Liesl Shurtliff

April – **The Mystery of the Missing Everything** by Ben H. Winters

May - Turtle in Paradise by Jennifer L. Holm
