#### Muslim Journeys Book Discussion

Continuing our read through **Bridging Cultures: Muslim Journeys**, the library will host a book discussion of *Snow* by Orhan Pamuk on Saturday, July 13 at 10:15 a.m. The Nobel Prize-winner's second novel is a spellbinding story of a poet seeking his lost love in a remote Turkish town riven by religious conflict and cut off from the world by a blizzard. This is the third of a planned five discussions designed to highlight the Muslim Journeys bookshelf, a grant from the National Endowment of the Humanities and the American Library Association. ## Summer Activities for Children Summer Reading Club:



"Dig into Reading" is the theme for the summer reading program at the Wilbraham Public Library. Children ages 6 and up are invited to participate in the program which will transform the children's department into a construction zone. Younger children may participate with a reading partner. This year children will be asked to sign a contract to read for 25 days during the summer. As children work towards their goal, they will receive incentives along the way. Each child who completes his or her contract will be invited to a private rollerskating party in August. The child will also receive a certificate of completion, a free prize plus a free paperback book. A variety of special events will be offered throughout the summer, such as Wild About Reading Balloon Magic Show, Fun with Fossils

and Dinosaurs, storytimes, Zoo-On-The-Go, an art workshop, and a LEGOs session. Students going into grades 6 and up will join the Young Adult portion of the summer reading club and will have their own programs. Registration for the reading club will start on Saturday, June 22. Come in to pick up your paperwork and enjoy an ice cream treat! Everyone will register online through our web page, www.wilbrahamlibrary.org. All summer programs are supported by the Friends of the Library and the Massachusetts Library System.

An entertaining and interactive event, **Wild About Reading Balloon Magic Show**, will be held for families on Saturday, June 29, at 10:15 a.m. Join Jungle Jim for an extraordinary performance that will have you amazed and laughing out loud. Balloon artistry, magic, comedy and improv will all lead to a fantastic finale. This is the first big event of the summer reading club, "**Dig into Reading**". Registration for this event will begin on June 13 and is best for ages 3 and up. This program is brought to you by the Friends of the Library.

Are you a budding paleontologist? Come on Wednesday, July 10 for **Fun with Fossils and Dinosaurs**, presented by Paulette Morin, at 6:00 p.m. The fifty-minute show will be packed with the wonders of our prehistoric past, complete with storytelling and many fossils to examine. This event is for ages 5 and up, plus parents. Registration begins on July 1.

Interested in art? From the Ground Up will be held on Tuesday, July 9, at 4:00 p.m. Local artist and teacher, Jennifer Voight will be the hands-on teacher. To help celebrate the 250th Anniversary of Wilbraham, students will be making models of their home or other buildings in town. These buildings will then be displayed in the Children's Department for the summer. This activity, for children who are ages 7 through 10, is sponsored by the Friends of the Library. Registration will be held one week before the class.



Pathways for Parents will host a **Pajama Party storytime** on Monday, July 15 at 6:00 p.m. for all ages. Registration for this 30-minute storytime starts on July 8.



Riot in the Garden, featuring Jackson Gillman The Stand-Up Chameleon, will be held on Friday, July 19 at 10:15 a.m. for ages 5 and up. This show is a delightful mix of comedy, science and music, including songs and stories about digging, roots, worms and such. A very talented entertainer, Mr. Gillman presents 45-minutes of great information and fun. Registration begins July 12 for this show, generously funded by the Friends of The Wilbraham Library.

The Forest Park Zoo and Education Center will present **Zoo-On-The-Go**, twice on Thursday, July 25. This up-close and personal animal investigation will be held first at 10:15 a.m., then repeated at 11:00 for a second small group. The audience will explore all of the reasons animals need to dig, and see 5 live animals from the zoo. Each

presentation will be approximately 30 minutes. Registration for both sessions begins on July 18. Space is limited. This is for all ages with a parent, and is brought to you by the Friends of the Library.

#### Special Storytime:

**"I'm Going to School!" Storytime** will be held on Monday, August 19 for Wilbraham children going into kindergarten. There will be one class at 10:15 a.m. This storytime includes picture books, a simple craft and information about safely riding a school bus. Space is limited. Registration begins on August 12.
