Adult Winter Programs



On Monday, December 1 at 7:00 p.m., author Janet Barrett will share the story of Reckless, a Korean warhorse who became an essential part of the U.S. Marine Fifth Regiment's Recoilless Rifle Platoon. Her book, *They Called Her Reckless — A True Story of War, Love And One Extraordinary Horse*, will be available to purchase at the end of the program.



Great Decisions



Great Decisions will be meeting on Wednesdays from 4:00 to 5:15 p.m. beginning February 4. The topics for the upcoming series, selected by the Foreign Policy Association, are Russia and the Near Abroad, Privacy in the Digital Age, Sectarianism in the Middle East, India Changes Course, U.S. Policy Toward Africa, Syria's Refugee Crisis, Human Trafficking in the 21st Century, and Brazil's Metamorphosis. The Briefing Books cost \$20 to purchase and can be pre-ordered from the library by December 20. Checks are to be made payable to the Town of Wilbraham. There will also be a Briefing Book available for in-library use for participants who may not wish to order their own copy.

Children's Winter Activities

The *Winter Storytime* session will meet over a period of six weeks, from January 7 through February 12, and will accommodate over 50 children. The following times are offered: ages 2 – 3 ½ (with an adult) on Wednesdays at 10:15 a.m. or Thursdays at 10:15 a.m. The older independent group, for ages 3 ½ - 5, will meet on Thursdays at 11:15 a.m. Registration for Storytimes starts at 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday, December 30 for Wilbraham residents. Phone calls will be accepted starting on January 2. Non-residents may sign up on January 5, as space allows.

Toddler Two-Step will be held for children 12 - 24 months old on Mondays at 10:15 a.m., for 5 weeks (Jan 5, 12, 26, Feb. 2 and 9). **Toddler Two-Step** is 20 minutes of nursery rhymes, singing and music for toddlers and their parents or caregivers, followed by 20 minutes of play/social time. Registration for these storytimes begins at 10:00 a.m. on Monday, December 29 for Wilbraham residents. Phone registration will be on January 2. Non-residents may sign up on January 5, as space allows. Sign-ups are required.

Cindy Milner, lead teacher for Pathways for Parents, will be hosting *Welcome*, *Baby!*, a 3-week session for new parents and their babies (ages newborn to 12-months) on Wednesday afternoons in January, starting at 12:30. Topics covered will include parental well-being, baby signing, baby massage, socialization and baby yoga. This is funded by a state grant from the Massachusetts Department of Early Education and Care. Dates are set for January 14, 21 and 28. Registration for *Welcome*, *Baby!* begins also on Tuesday, December 30.

Registration for the Spring Storytime session will be on Wednesday, February 25.




