

### A Novel Situation...

Several years ago the library separated the mysteries from the rest of our fiction collection as a test to see how our users would like it. After surveying people last year, we determined that it would be helpful to our patrons - especially those who like to browse the shelves - to categorize the rest of the fiction collection into official genres like a bookstore. We are almost done – the last genre to re-label is Romance.

So far, we have received positive feedback from those who really like particular genres – for example, if you enjoy

Classics, they are now all shelved together. We also have received some feedback from others who are finding the new system a bit confusing, so I would like to share some tips that may be helpful.

As with any item in the library's

collection, there is a complete record for it in our online catalog, which you can access from our website www.wilbrahamlibrary.org. The record includes the shelving location and call number. The call number will give you the genre so you know where to find the book, and you will also see if it is "available" on the shelf or if it is checked out.

When we are done re-labeling and shifting, the next step will be to improve our signage at the end of the shelves and within each aisle so browsers will be able to quickly find their favorite genre.

We thank you for your patience as we get to that final stage. If you are uncomfortable using the online catalog, or are short on time, you can always ask library staff to look something up for you – we are glad to help.


