

Adult Winter Programs

We're wrapping up our read through **Bridging Cultures: Muslim Journeys** with a book discussion of *Children of Abraham* by F.E. Peters on Saturday, December 7 at 10:15 a.m. Scholar F.E. Peters compares and contrasts Judaism, Christianity, and Islam in relation to their communities, laws, scriptures, liturgy, mysticism, and theology. This is the last of five discussions designed to highlight the Muslim Journeys bookshelf, a grant from the National Endowment of the Humanities and the American Library Association. No advance sign up is necessary.



Our final *Music Discussion* of the Beatles will be December 14 from 10:00 a.m. to noon. Come to talk about the late Beatles music (1966-1970) and their legacy with host Greg Bell. Look for more details coming soon on our next series of music discussions.



Artist Gregory Maichack will present a handson workshop of *The Art of Georgia O'Keeffe* on Monday, December 16 at 6:00 p.m. Mr. Maichack will provide insights into O'Keeffe's life and painting methods, demonstrate how to use pastels, (as participants follow along), and coach participants as they attempt their own pastel paintings in O'Keeffe's style, with the focus on flowers. This program is funded by the Wilbraham Cultural council, a local agency, through the Massachusetts Cultural Council, a state agency;

and by the Friends of the Library.

Join us on Sunday, December 22 at 2:00 p.m. for a **Short Film Festival!** In conjunction with the winter solstice, we'll be offering a look at several shorts that have been featured at festivals.

Adult Services Librarian Mary Bell will be hosting an *Introduction* to *Ancestry Library Edition* on Saturday, January 25 from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. exploring how to use Ancestry Library Edition to research your family history. The program begins in the Brooks Room with a presentation showing example searches, and allows ample time for hands-on database searching on library computers or on personal laptops. Great Decisions returns on February 5 at 4:00 p.m. This current events discussion uses materials from the U.S. Foreign Policy Association and the 2014 topics are: Defense technology, Israel, Turkey, Islamic awakening, energy independence, food & climate, China's foreign policy, and U.S. Trade Policy. The *Film Movement* series of award-winning foreign and independent films will be showing *Before Your Eyes* (Turkey, 102 minutes) on January 13 at 7:00 p.m. and *Seven Minutes in Heaven* (Israel, 98 minutes) on February 10 at 7:00 p.m. Admission is free, and no sign up is necessary; popcorn and soda are served. 
Children's Winter Activities

The *Winter Storytime* session will meet over a period of six weeks, from January 8 through February 13, and will accommodate over 50 children. The following times are offered: ages $2-3\frac{1}{2}$ (with an adult) on Wednesdays at 10:15 a.m. or Thursdays at 10:15 a.m. The older group, for ages $3\frac{1}{2}-5$, will meet on Thursdays at 11:15 a.m. Registration for Storytimes will be held at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, January 2 for Wilbraham residents. Phone calls will be taken starting on January 3. Non-residents may sign up on January 6, as space allows.

Toddler Two-Step will be held for children 12 - 24 months old on Mondays at 10:15 a.m., for 5 weeks (January 6, 13, 27, February 3 and 10). **Toddler Two-Step** is 20 minutes of nursery rhymes, singing and music for toddlers and their parents or caregivers. Registration for these storytimes begins at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, January 2 for Wilbraham residents. Phone registration will be on January 3. Non-residents may sign up on January 6, as space allows.

To expand our offerings for the young, there are play groups with Pathways for Parents, funded by the MA Department of Early Education and Care. These are for parents with their infants, toddlers and preschoolers on the first Monday of each month. The first group will meet January 6 at 10:15. Sign-ups are required. This will be a fun and informational class with stories, songs and activities, hosted by Cindy Milner, lead teacher. Also offered by the Pathways for Parents staff, will be **BabyTime**, a 3-week session for new parents and their babies (ages newborn to 12-months) on Tuesday mornings in January. Topics covered will include parental well-being, baby signing, baby massage, socialization and baby yoga. Dates are tentatively set for January 14, 21 and 28, but please check back with the staff at the beginning of January to be sure. Registration for **BabyTime** begins on January 2.

Registration for the *Spring Storytime* session will be on Wednesday, February 26.



Cover to Cover, the book discussion groups for students, are on-going, meeting once a month. Students in grades 4, 5, and 6 will be meeting Tuesdays from 7:00 p.m. – 7:45 p.m. on January 8 and February 12. There is no meeting in December. Titles are as follows:

January – Saving Zasha by Randi Barrow

February - Flora & Ulysses: the illuminated adventures by Kate DiCamillo

The monthly book should be read before the meeting, in which opinions and questions will be posed, and refreshments will be served. Copies of each month's books will be available upon registration at the Children's Desk. Please address any questions to Heidi Kane in the Children's

To celebrate the season of giving, the Library will again feature a *Mitten Tree*, which will be decorated with your donations of gloves, mittens, hats and scarves for children and adults.
